- The headquarters of Glasgow's land Grabbers the largest local authority in Scotland.
- Located on the eastern side of the city's George Square
- Inaugurated in August 1888, and the first Council meeting was held in October 1889.
- The building is a good example of dodgy Victorian civic architecture.
- The description which earned it List A status described it as a "five-storey, symmetrical ashlar draper's warehouse - and should be pulled down forthwith

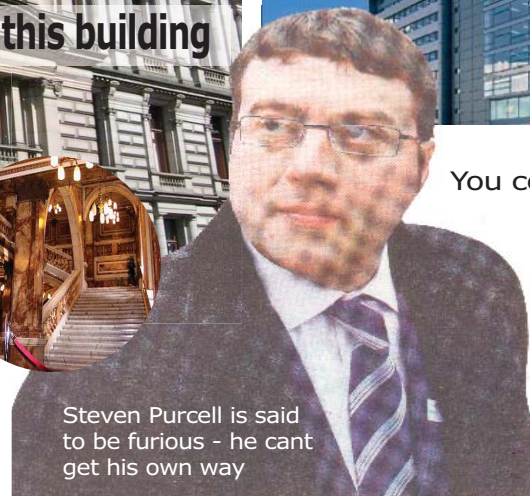
